Dr. Keeler is a professor at Ohio State's John Glenn School of Public Affairs and does research in environmental and natural resource economics and policy. Keeler served as the Senior Staff Economist for Environment at the President's Council of Economic Advisers (2000 – 2001) where he was a member of the US negotiating team for climate change and a diplomatic representative to OECD meetings on coordinating national sustainability policies. He served on the White House climate change policy teams under both President Clinton and President Bush. Keeler has also worked as a senior economist at the Environmental Protection Agency's Innovative Strategies and Economics Group (1999-2000) and as an Economist for the Republic of Tanzania's Marketing Development Bureau (1982-1985). Keeler received his B.A. in Economics from the University of North Carolina and his Ph.D. in Agricultural and Resource Economics from the University of California, Berkeley.
